

Gordon blue!

CELEBRITY chef Gordon Ramsay's foul-mouthed bust up with a top Inverness chef is set for a small screen airing later this month.

Whilst filming at the Glenmoriston Town House Hotel earlier this year, the fiery chef blew his lid with French cook Loic Lefebvre, who allegedly refused to dish up good old fashioned Scottish dinners.

Now in its second series, Channel 4's *Ramsay's Kitchen Nightmares* features the plush Inverness hotel on June 14.

The Glenmoriston's La Riviera restaurant, which at the time of filming had three AA stars, is regarded as one of the best in Inverness – but almost inevitably Ramsay felt it could do better.

And while Ramsay dishes out some typically tough advice, it seems he may have had the missing ingredient.

For following his visit to the Ness Bank based

hotel, it scooped another top award.

Owner Barry Larsen explained: "With Gordon's help, we won the Scottish Hotel Restaurant of the Year Award.

"Having Gordon Ramsay in our kitchen gave us the opportunity to learn from one of the best chefs in the world.

"Like Loic Lefebvre, Gordon has trained and worked in top restaurants so he was able to advise us on how to be the best."

Viewers will see bad-tempered Ramsay storm out of the kitchen after telling Lefebvre what to do with his posh nosh.

In the first series of the show in which the hot-headed cook goes into other people's kitchens and tells them where they are going wrong, Ramsay was filmed throwing up outside a West Yorkshire restaurant after the chef fed him scallops that had gone off.

Former Rangers player Ramsay first hit the

Channel 4 screens in 1999 with *Ramsay's Boiling Point*, then in 2001 he helped transform a

burger van vendor into an haute cuisine chef in *Faking It*. And last year, he

turned *Brookside* babe Jennifer Ellison into a top notch cook in *Hell's Kitchen*.
